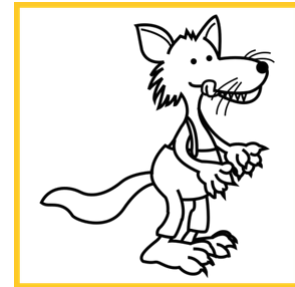


Little Red Riding Hood

A good girl who brings food to her grandmother.

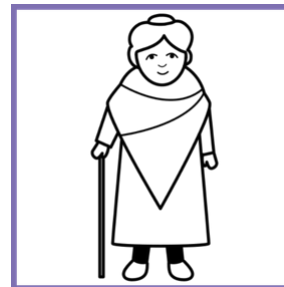
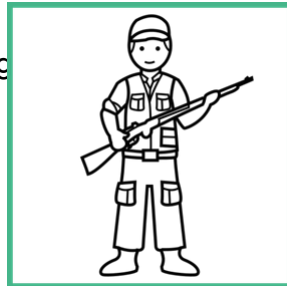
Wolf
